> versions of fall's palette will be popular for spring. The clothing ranges from casual beachwear to wedding outfits, with plenty of business attire added to the mix. Cleary keeps Toujours stocked with jewelry, footwear, hats and other eye-catching accessories, leaning toward the more artsy pieces.
